



Memorandum of Understanding

Between

Ala-Too International University and SECAB (Socio Economic Cultural Association Bijapur), Karnataka, India agree to cooperate on international Programmes based on the principle of reciprocity.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) encourages the exchange of faculty members, scholars, students, academic information and materials in the belief that the research and educational processes at both universities will be enhanced and that mutual understanding between their respective faculty members, scholars and students will be increased by the establishment of such exchanges.

1. The Institutes /universities agree to promote the following exchange activities and cooperation (either in person or online) based on their respective academic and educational needs:
 - a. Exchange of faculty members and scholars (professors, lecturers, researchers or staff)
 - b. Exchange of students (including undergraduate and graduate students)
 - c. Exchange of academic information and materials
 - d. Exchange of periodical academic publications
 - e. Organization of joint research programmes
 - f. Organization of joint conferences
 - g. Other academic exchanges agreed to by both universities
2. The implementation of each specific exchange programme and cooperation based on this MoU shall be separately negotiated and determined by both parties. Efforts shall be made by both sides to find financial sources for carrying out the exchange programmes and cooperation.
3. Nothing shall diminish the full autonomy of either institution, nor will any constraints or financial obligations be imposed by either upon the other in carrying out the MoU.
4. This MoU is in force for five years and is subject to revision or modification by mutual agreement. It will be automatically renewed on an annual basis thereafter, unless terminated or replaced with a new agreement. It is also understood that either institution may terminate the MoU at any time, although such action will only be taken after mutual consultation in order to avoid any possible inconvenience to both parties.

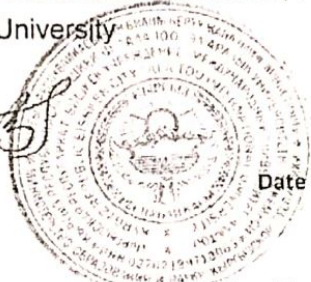

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE UNIVERSITY
Penn State Worthington - Scranton
Pennsylvania, United States of America

and

SOCIO ECONOMIC CULTURAL ASSOCIATION - BIJAPUR
Karnataka State, India

WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University ("Penn State"), on behalf of its Penn State Worthington-Scranton campus, and Socio Economic Cultural Association Bijapur ("SECAB"), on behalf of its associated institutions, acknowledge their strong mutual friendship and existing cultural and educational collaboration; and

WHEREAS, Penn State and SECAB (hereinafter known individually as "Party" and collectively as "Parties") take cognizance of the profound impact of higher education on rural economic and social development and desire to strengthen bilateral relations in the field of both technical and non-technical education, culture, and value-based learning;

NOW THEREFORE, in order to promote cooperation in education and research in areas of mutual interest pursuant to the prevailing needs and requirements in their respective communities, the Parties hereby agree to the following:

- I. Scope. The Parties will endeavor to promote the following types of collaboration:
 - A. Faculty exchange program and research engagement activities;
 - B. Joint supervision of graduate research projects and theses;
 - C. Hosting industrial, cultural, and academic visits for students and faculty;
 - D. Participation in joint seminars, conferences, professional development workshops and other academic events; and
 - E. Exchange of scientific materials, publications and information.
- II. Activities under this Memorandum of Understanding. Activities taking place under this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") will be initiated primarily by various research centers and academic units within each Party, and in coordination with their respective administrative units concerned with international activities. All activities undertaken must conform to the policies and procedures in place at each Party. The host institution shall provide office space and give access to libraries and other facilities to exchange faculty and research scholars. Teaching beyond occasional lectures shall normally be in accordance with established rules and regulations of the host institution and must be approved by the appropriate units within each Party.

- III. Planning and Management of Activities. Each Party shall designate a contact person (liaison) to maintain communication and coordinate specific activities or projects. The terms of each distinct collaboration activity or project shall be discussed and agreed upon by the Parties and stipulated in a separate written agreement.
- IV. Funding of Activities. Collaborating units are encouraged to work together to identify and secure outside funding as needed. Financial arrangements and obligations for each activity shall be stipulated in separate agreements prior to the initiation of any such activity.
- V. Nondiscrimination. The Parties are committed to the policy that, subject to applicable laws, statues, codes, or guidelines, all persons shall have equal access to programs, facilities, admission, and employment without regard to personal characteristics not related to ability, performance, or qualifications as determined by the respective policies of the Parties, or by government authorities. Both Parties shall abide by these principles in the administration of this MOU, and no Party shall impose criteria on any scholars, faculty, students or staff which would violate these principles of nondiscrimination. Nothing herein shall be deemed to create any obligation for any Party to violate any applicable law, statute, code or guideline in order to provide such access.
- VI. Intellectual Property Rights. This MOU only covers research and academic cooperation, and does not cover the generation of intellectual property. Any intellectual property generated shall be covered under a separate agreement between the Parties.
- VII. Export Control. The Parties hereby acknowledge that performance and obligations hereunder may be subject to United States export laws, and, to the extent such controls are applicable, performance of some desired activities under this MOU may be delayed, restricted or prohibited. Neither Party shall have any obligation to obtain clearances to perform any function, activity, effort, proposal or program which is deemed by such Party to be restricted by United States export law, and any refusal to perform such function, activity, effort, proposal or program as a result of a decision not to obtain necessary clearances shall not constitute a breach of this MOU.
- VIII. Use of Name, Logo, and Mark. Neither Party may use the name, logo, or mark of the other in any promotional or advertising material (including but not limited to website postings, public announcements and program brochures) without the prior written consent of the other Party pursuant to each Party's policies.



- IX. Evaluation of Collaboration. All specific programs or projects undertaken pursuant to this agreement will be subject to mutual periodic evaluation by the appropriate authorities of the Parties engaged in such programs or projects.
- X. Term, Amendment, Renewal, Termination. This MOU will become effective on the date of the last signature, for a period of 5 (five) years. It constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties, and may only be amended or renewed in writing signed by authorized representatives of both Parties. Each Party shall have the right to terminate this MOU by providing written notice to the other Party at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination.
- XI. Originals. The Parties shall sign two (2) original hard copies of this MOU in the English language. Each Party shall retain one (1) original.

It is a composite and comprehensive MoU between the Institute / Universities / parties for their Institutions and Associate group of SECAB.

Recitals:

- Desiring to strengthen bilateral relations in the field of education both technical, non-technical, literature, Cultural and value based learning.
- Taking cognizance of the profound impact of higher education on rural economic and social development.
- The two institute / universities will endeavor to cooperate in education and research in areas of mutual interest. To the extent feasible, both universities will encourage direct contact and cooperation between faculty members, departments, research institutions and students.
- To enrich the exposure towards fundamental and soft skills among the students of both the institutions / universities.
- Pursuant to the prevailing needs, requirements and norms in their respective educational campuses;

AREAS OF COOPERATION

The specific and core areas of cooperation and understanding between the two institutes / universities may include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Exchange of faculty;
2. Exchange of students;
3. Joint research activities and lectures;
4. Joint PhD programs;
5. Participation in seminars, conferences and academic meetings;
6. Exchange of published academic materials and other information;
7. Dual diploma programs;
8. Special short-term academic and professional programs;
9. Distance Learning programs.

EXCHANGE OF FACULTY

- a) Although travel expenses will be borne by the traveler whereas, accommodation should be taken care of by the host institution.
- b) The host institution shall provide office space and give access to libraries and other facilities to exchange faculty and research scholars.
- c) Faculty/scholar exchanges will normally be for duration of up to one calendar year, or longer subject to agreement
- d) Faculty/Scholar exchanges remain subject to the approval of the host institution.
- e) Each professor remains on salary with the home institution during the exchange, and remuneration for special projects is subject to special negotiation.
- f) Visiting professor/scholars must carry medical health insurance in accordance with the rules and regulations of the host institutions and/or the host government.
- g) Teaching course loads and working hours and conditions shall normally be in accordance with established rules and practices of the host institution, subject to prior negotiation agreement.
- h) The protocol between SDU and SECAB may be in any appropriate academic field at either institution, subject to the prior approval of the administration of the host institution.

EXCHANGE OF STUDENTS

- a) Exchange students shall be admitted as non-degree students for a period of one or two semesters or for a maximum of one academic year.
- b) Exchange students may take courses for credit, and the institution shall issue a transcript and grades for exchange students under the same rules and regulations as for its degree-seeking students.

- c) So long as the principle of reciprocity is maintained, tuition fees shall be waived for exchange students by either institution.
- d) Exchange students shall be recommended by the sending institution and follow established rules and procedures set forth by the institution.

RENEWAL, TERMINATION, AND AMENDMENT


- a) These regulations are to be authorized by the official representative of both universities in two copies, and each party will retain one.
- b) Except where specified and agreed upon, this protocol will impose no financial obligation on the host institution.
- c) The period of validity of this Protocol is for five (5) years. Thereafter, it may be renewed, unless either side provides a six-month notice of intent to terminate. This protocol will, after the approval of their respective competent authorities, become effective at the time it is signed.
- d) Items not covered by the Protocol may be determined and negotiated separately by both institutions without abrogating this Protocol; the Protocol may be amended with the consent of both parties.

This protocol is signed in 2 original copies in English, and all of them having the same legal validity. Each party holds one original of signed Protocol.


